Additionally, while at the Wolfeboro PD, Chief Keaton wrote and monitored the COPS Grant and all associated government reports. He brings with him years of experience and specialized training in many investigative areas including domestic violence and child abuse, DARE and school resource officer operations, grant writing, accident reconstruction, background investigations, sex offender investigations and registration, conflict resolution and problem solving. He is also the recipient of the 2015 Paul Harris Fellows Award from the Wolfeboro Rotary for his exceptional service to the community.

According to Chief Champlin, "Chris is a perfect fit for the Town of Bartlett. He is honest and has a high degree of integrity, and is committed to the values of community policing. He is also used to working in a small town and understands the dynamics which make Bartlett and New Hampshire special."
