K. McEnaney stated that he attended the Hazard Mitigation meeting and he wanted to know if the Selectmen as health officers get any designated training. Selectman Garland mentioned that there is a class coming up which she is planning on attending.

K. McEnaney inquired that when a light pole is knocked down and the stores lose their power do the Selectmen go look at the food. Selectman Patch commented that the State watches things like that. K. McEnaney inquired as to what happens if water contamination should show up. Selectman Patch explained that NH Department of Environmental Service handles that. The State and NHDES keep us informed of anything like that and we post their notices.

The Selectmen signed checks, reviewed building permits and correspondence throughout the meeting.
